Reflection Luke 18:1-8

The Gospel of Luke as we have seen returns often to the theme of prayer. Not only does Jesus teach about prayer but he is depicted as a man of prayer. When he speaks about it he does so in terms that may surprise us. His focus is on the attitude of the one praying rather than on God.

For Jesus, it goes without saying that he trusts deeply that God hears our prayer. Jesus' concern is that we might not believe this and so give up. Therefore in Luke we see people praising and thanking God, giving out to God, turning to him in their need. The message is simple: keep on praying and remember that its purpose is not to change God but to change us.

Dear God,

Too often I remember the bad things and not the good. Help me to see things as they are.. Fully of happy moments not to be taken for granted. As I reflect on my life let me know hope.
