CHRIST ON THE STREET

Christ on the Street, a diocesan ministry, will soon complete its third year of outreach to homeless and lonely persons in the Waterford area. Pairs of volunteers, recognizable by their bright blue jackets, make weekly visits to the City Centre and outside local supermarkets, where they meet and chat with their "Friends on the Street". To bring Christ to others, the missionaries must first experience Him themselves. They are encouraged to deepen their personal encounter with Christ through frequent Mass, the Sacrament of Reconciliation and prayer.

Each team is encouraged to meet at the Cathedral to pray for the persons they will meet during their encounter with them and to pray together for them afterwards also. Christ on the Street involves ongoing conversation with those who spend their days sitting on the ground or along the quay, often with a donation cup by their side. While our missionaries may offer an occasional tea and perhaps a sandwich, their primary ministry is to make a personal connection with each person they meet. As trust grows, regular encounters become times of deeper sharing and healthy friendship.

For some, this relationship is a turning point in their lives, restoring their sense of self-worth, which can lead to the decision to change their present situation to a better way of life. The missionaries can then encourage and accompany them to existing health and housing services.
