TWO JOURNEYS (Luke 15:1-3;11-32)

It could be said that there are two important journeys in the great parable of the Prodigal Son. One is that of the younger brother who realises the foolishness of his ways and turns towards home not sure what to expect and certainly not expecting what he finds there.

The other journey is, at least in distance, much shorter. It is that of the older brother who remains out in the fields unable to make the brief trip home because of his rage and anger. In Lent the focus is usually on the long return home, but it might well be that for many of us the real challenge is to recognise in ourselves the desire to limit God's mercy to those we consider worthy. Such a mindset may still keep us away from our true home with the Father.

What Paul is saying about reconciliation is explained in the gospel

for today, not by concepts or ideas, but in the story of the Prodigal Son. If the season of Lent were to come and go without us giving time to thinking about reconciliation, then something would indeed be missing.



It would be tragic if we came to Easter without

being moved by the overwhelming compassion of our God who seeks out the lost and celebrates our return to him. It would also be tragic if we were to forget that if we welcome God's forgiveness for ourselves then we automatically become ambassadors of that forgiveness to others. We must be careful not to end up like the older brother who is resentful of God's generosity to the undeserving.

ACT JUSTLY... LOVE TENDERLY..WALK HUMBLY

Lent coincides with the arrival of spring, the lengthening of days and the appearance of crocuses, snowdrops and daffodils. They have all refused to give in to the weight of snow, the sharpness of the frost and the lack of light. They just grow despite everything.

Lent is an invitation to us to do something similar. It's an invitation to grow, to recognize that when all is said and done we are spiritual people and that we need to pay attention to that. What it means to be spiritual is beautifully summed up by the prophet Micah when he reminded people that God only asks three things of us ".... act justly, love tenderly and walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8)

So if we want something to do for Lent there we have it:

Act Justly – reflect on the injustice around us and do something to change it.

Love Tenderly – forget myself and reach out to those in need

Walk Humbly – take time to pray, make a space for God and the Good News in our busy lives.

'We proclaim the resurrection of Christ when his light illuminates the dark moments of our existence, and we are able share it with others; when we know when to smile with those who smile, and weep with those who weep; when we accompany those who are sad and at risk of losing hope; when we recount our experience of faith to those who are searching for meaning and happiness... and there – with our attitude, with our witness, with our life – we say 'Jesus is Risen,' with our soul.'
